Playwright

Sarah Berthiaume is a Canadian playwright and screenwriter, originally trained as a performer at l'Option-Théâtre Lionel-Groulx.

She is the author of Le déluge après, Disparitions, Villes mortes, Nous habiterons Détroit, Nyotaimori and Antioche, which received excellent reviews at the 2019 Avignon festival.

Sarah is also a collaborator for the television show *Plus on est de fous, plus on lit,* which airs on Radio Canada's *Ici Première* station. She is in charge of the *Écrivains sur le terrain* segment, along with Alain Farah.

Her play *Yukonstyle*, winner of the Sony Labou Tansi prize in 2015, was translated into many languages and she is currently working on a film adaptation.

Her translation of The Medea Effect by Suzie Bastien (hotINK festival, New York, and Talisman Theatre, 2012) won the 2013 META Award for Outstanding New Translation.

Director

Since graduating in Theatre Studies from the Sorbonne Paris III in 2012, Véa has built a strong, multidisciplinary theatre background that includes: running her own company, director assisting the of the London/Paris-based company C(h)aracteres; co-founding the theatre collective Ce n'était pas du vin; directing Iseult&Evaelle, a show for teens presented in Montreal's Accès Culture network (2016); and staging La chasse aux billes, a unique blend of theatre and urban dance for kids, at Place des Arts in 2017.

She has also acted as creative director for many projects in the fields of dance, music, and cinema.

Since 2017 she is the Artistic Director for Neweb Labs, an innovative digital media company.

Light Designer

Cara Gabriel Sarah Nadine Véa Martin Ariane Guillaume

Martin Sirois is a light artist who works primarily in theatre. His signature geometric lighting designs were recently seen in creation with Christian Lapointe, Eric Jean, Wajdi Mouawad, Hanna Abd El Nour and Alexandre Marine.

Focusing on the architectural features of light, Sirois shapes the darkness and then the setting with angles and colours. Cut with surgical precision, the darkness creates a space above the body and sets the stage. In short, it gives the scene a decorative and scenic value, instilling psychological and emotional intent into the light even before attempting to show an object or a character. This technique brings the viewer into a place where they are ready to listen, so that they may feel and discover the piece.

Sirois graduated from the production program at the National Theatre School of Canada in 2005.

Costumes & Props

Cara Gabriel Sarah Nadine Véa Martin Ariane Guillaume

Ariane Valade is a visual artist and costume designer.

Her work explores the material possibilities of textiles via layering, repetition, and collage. Using specialized techniques from the field of fibres, she experiments with various approaches to design intuitive pieces.

Ariane has a bachelor's degree in design and fashion from UQAM (2011). In 2010, she participated in an internship at the Paris national Opera, where she learned techniques related to costuming for classical and contemporary dance. These new techniques solidified her interest in textiles.

As a member of Atelier Circulaire since October 2020, she has pursued research in print media and fibres, an interest which developed during her collegial studies at Centre design et impression textile du Cégep du Vieux Montréal.
